- Parents/guardians request that the student no longer take part in the services. In this case the parents/guardians complete this form and send it to the district office. The form will then be placed in the student's file, and they will be exited from services.
- The student no longer meets eligibility requirements for the HCP. Students who are identified as potentially HC are not guaranteed continuation of services. Continuation is contingent upon currently qualifying for services based on test results and school performance, student interest and effort.
