

PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Starting Monday, April 8, parents may begin registering their children for preschool or kindergarten for the 2019-20 school year. Registration packets will be available in the elementary school office, or you may call and request that one be mailed to you. Students are not considered registered unless the school has received a completed packet. Registration help is available in English and Spanish in the office.

When you submit your registration packet, you will also need to bring:

Your child's **birth certificate**

Your child's **immunization record** (to assist you in filling out the WA. State Certificate of Immunization Status form)

If your current living situation is such that you cannot provide all documents needed, please contact the Dean of Students Darby Hammond at 784-1314.

PRESCHOOL:

We will offer one or two sessions of preschool Monday through Friday, depending on the number of students who enroll. **There is a limit on the number of students we can enroll** for each preschool session, so **we will register students on a FIRST COME-FIRST SERVED basis**, with preference given to students who reside in the Entiat School District. Students who register after the maximum number has been reached will be placed on a waiting list in case openings occur later in the school year.

To enter **Preschool**, children must be **4 years of age** on or before August 31, 2019.

KINDERGARTEN:

Only children who have not attended our district preschool must register for kindergarten. Children must be **5 years of age** on or before August 31, 2019 to enter **kindergarten**.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS:

If your child's immunizations are not current at registration time, and you have immunizations scheduled for prior to the start of school, proof of a doctor's appointment date will be acceptable for registration. Immunizations must be current before the start of school.

Washington law requires children entering **Kindergarten** to have the following immunizations:

Vaccine	Requirement
Hepatitis B	Three doses - series should be completed within 9 months of starting school.
DTaP, DT, Td, or Tdap <i>diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis</i> (whooping cough)	Five doses (<i>Four doses only if fourth dose given on or after fourth birthday.</i>)
Varicella (Chickenpox)	Two doses, both given after 1 st birthday, 28 days apart (<i>Or medical provider diagnosis/verification of disease</i>)
Polio	Four doses, if all given before 4 th birthday. (<i>Three doses only if third dose given on or after fourth birthday.</i>)
Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR)	Two doses are required.

CHILD FIND—APRIL 11

Child Find is a federal program available through public schools that is designed to locate and evaluate children, age birth through age 21, who may have a disability that hinders educational development. Entiat School District offers this free screening to children who live within the district's boundaries, including home-schooled and private school students. If your family is living in a temporary situation, you may contact the school district where you are staying to attend a screening, as all Washington school districts have Child Find screenings available.

Children may qualify for special education and related health services if they have delays in speech, language, fine motor, gross motor, behavior skills, and/or learning, or if their learning is impacted by vision, hearing and mobility limitations.
