(WAC [392-170-035](#), WAC [392-170-036](#)) Students may be nominated any time during the school year by parents, community members or teachers.

## Definition of Highly Capable:

*"Students who perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels when compared with others of their age, experiences, or environments. Outstanding abilities are seen within students' general intellectual aptitudes, specific academic abilities, and/or creative productivities within a specific domain. Students who are highly capable may possess, but are not limited to, these learning characteristics:*

- (1) Capacity to learn with unusual depth of understanding, to retain what has been learned, and to transfer learning to new situations;*
- (2) Capacity and willingness to deal with increasing levels of abstraction and complexity earlier than their chronological peers;*
- (3) Creative ability to make unusual connections among ideas and concepts;*
- (4) Ability to learn quickly in their area(s) of intellectual strength; and*
- (5) Capacity for intense concentration and/or focus."*
