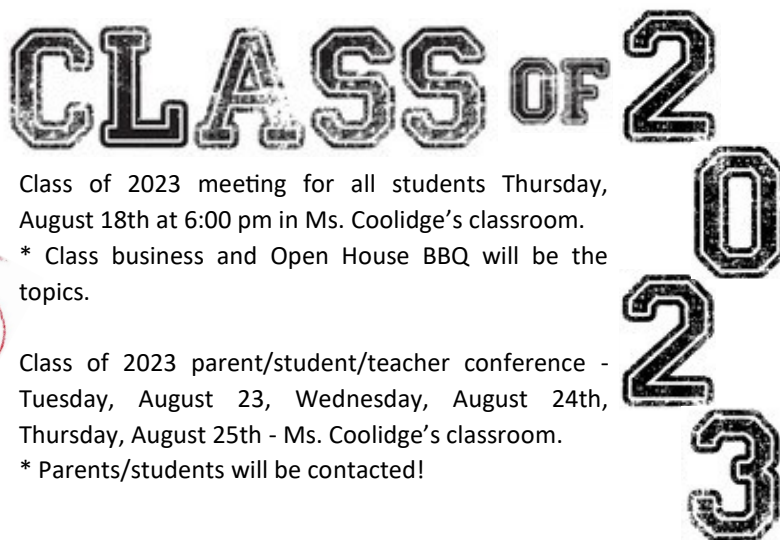

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Entiat Families and Community Members,

I have always felt that the phrase “school’s out for summer” is a misnomer. While it’s true that many staff, students and families are getting in much needed vacation time, there is still a lot going on in the school district. Our maintenance crews are working hard maintaining the grounds, waxing floors, shampooing carpets and preparing rooms for summer school. This job became a little tougher when our school was used for 4 days as a fire camp for the Stayman Flats fire. In spite of some interruptions to the summer maintenance, we’re always glad to help out the DNR and Forest Service as they protect our community. I appreciate the extra mile our grounds and custodial crew go to have our school ready for the upcoming year.

Student athletes and coaches are involved in summer athletic camps, open gyms/courts and conditioning activities. The football team hosted 5 teams for 3 days on our campus that provided great competition and skill-building. The boys’ basketball team traveled to Ilwaco and Port Angeles for team camps. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Entiat Families and Community Members,

It is hard to believe in a few short weeks we will be wrapping up summer plans and starting our 2022 – 2023 academic year! Our maintenance crew has been incredibly busy preparing our building for the First Day of School on August 31st! Our grounds and classrooms are looking amazing! Teachers are also filtering in to prepare for each of your student’s return.

Over the summer, we’ve had many staff members preparing for 2022 – 2023. They have been hard at work updating Athletic Codes, student and staff handbooks, and more! Our 6-12th grade teams have also been preparing for Back-to-School Conferences and Orientations. If you have a student in MS/HS, you will receive information from your student’s advisor soon to arrange either a conference or invite you to their grade-level orientation August 23rd – August 25th. These meetings will be valuable in preparing a successful school year.

Several teachers have also been involved in the planning of our Summer School Program which looks a bit different this year. Students received an invitation to participate in the X-STREAM Summer School Program, August 1st – August 11th, (8:15 am – 2:45 pm – Monday through Thursday). NOTE for parents of elementary students! The school district has coordinated with the classroom teachers in grades preK-5 to reduce the amount of school supplies that parents are asked to provide in the fall. Instead, the district will purchase these supplies in bulk and help you keep a few more dollars in your pocket!

4th & 5th Grade Band: 1" binder (any color), 10 clear sleeves, pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencil, 1 high lighter. (reeds/oil/grease as needed for instrument) Dress for Performances: Girl black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie.

P.E.: K-5: water bottle & tennis shoes that tie.

P.E.: 6th-12th grade: Black gym shorts or sweats, grey or orange shirt, socks and tennis shoes.

6th, 7th, & 8th: Pencils, pens (black or blue), erasers, 3-ring binder, notebooks paper, highlighter, dividers, pencil pouch, colored pencils, glue stick, 6 spiral notebooks, Scientific calculator (TI-34 Multi-View (recommended) or graphing calculator (TI-84 will be used in high school)).

High School: Pencils, pens (blue or black), erasers, 3-ring binder, notebook paper, dividers, colored pencils, scissors, glue stick.

Band: Pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencil, 1 high lighter. (reeds/oil/grease as needed for instrument). Dress for Performance: Girls: black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie. 3" inch binder, solid black marching shoes.

Art: Smock (old shirt is fine).

History: 1.5" or 2" binder to be left in the classroom.

Math: graphing calculator (TI 83 or TI 84), 2.5" to 3" binder, 500 sheets of 3-hole punched graph paper (4 squares per inch), 2 red pens. Compass, protractor, subject dividers, 4 colored pencils (optional).

Science: Spiral bound notebook or composition notebook, 1.5" 3-ring binder, ruler.

School breakfast and lunch will be offered daily in the Commons/Cafeteria for all Entiat students. (The Grab 'n Go meals served during our COVID hybrid schedules will no longer be provided.)

Entiat Schools will operate under a meal program authorized by the USDA that allows **ALL** students to receive school meals **FREE** through the 2022-23 school year **regardless** of their income or meal status

Students will still need to pay for a la carte items and individual milks and can charge these items to their school meal accounts.

Even though USDA has extended free meals for all students for the year, some families will still need to **fill out an Application for Free or Reduced Meals** to help determine district eligibility for other state and federal programs and funding, so we urge you to **submit the application if you receive one in your child's Final Forms**. (Some students will be automatically coded Free or Reduced through the Direct Certification process and will not receive an application in their Final Forms or need to submit one.)

El desayuno y almuerzo escolar se ofrecerán todos los días en el Cafetería para todos los estudiantes de Entiat. (Las comidas para llevar que fueron ofrecidos durante el último año escolar ya no están disponibles).

Las escuelas de Entiat operarán bajo un programa de comidas autorizado por el USDA que permite que **TODOS** los estudiantes reciban comidas escolares **GRATIS** durante el año escolar 2022-23, **sin importar** sus ingresos o estado de comidas.

Los estudiantes todavía tendrán que pagar para alimentos adicionales o para leches individuales y pueden cargarlos a su cuenta de comidas escolares.

Aunque el USDA ha extendido las comidas gratuitas para todos los estudiantes durante el año escolar, algunas familias aún necesitarán **completar una Aplicación de Comidas Gratis o Reducidas** para ayudar a establecer el nivel de estatus Gratis/Reducido para todo el distrito escolar. El nivel Gratis/Reducido del Distrito se utiliza para determinar la elegibilidad del distrito para otros programas y fondos estatales y federales, por lo que le recomendamos que envíe la **aplicación si recibe una en el regreso Final Forms de su hijo**. (Algunos estudiantes se codificarán automáticamente como Gratis o Reducido a través del proceso de Certificación Directa y no recibirán una aplicación en su paquete y ni tendrán que enviar una)



CHANGE TO ASB CARDS AND ATHLETIC EVENT TICKET FEES:

The Washington State Legislature passed HB1660 that requires that school districts **waive all fees** for **attendance at or participation in** any optional, non-credit extracurricular event of cultural, social, recreational, or athletic nature **for students who are low income**. The law also requires the districts to reduce fees for students' family members and nonstudents over the age of 65 who, by reason of their low income, may be unable to pay the fees to attend these type of events. The purpose of this law was to remove financial obstacles that would potentially prevent students and their families from being able to fully participate in extracurricular activities.

The district's percentage of students who are considered low income is around 65%. To avoid the complications of operating separate systems for selling ASB Cards and Event Tickets to both non-low and low income students and family members, in July the Entiat School Board adopted Policy 3510 that eliminated both ASB Card fees and Event Ticket Fees for ALL students and non-students completely, regardless of income. Elimination of participation fees (ASB Card Fees) will make it easier financially for ALL students to participate in extracurricular activities. The District hopes that by removing attendance fees (ticket charges) for athletic events (high school football, volleyball and basketball; track and tennis and middle school events already do not charge ticket fees), attendance and support for these activities from the community at large will increase.

Local enrichment levy funds as well as additional monies generated by Associated Student Body (ASB) fundraising will be used to make up for the loss of ASB revenue resulting from no ASB Card and ticket sales.
