BUS ROUTES & LOADING ZONES

Buses will load and unload students in the bus loading zone, in the north elementary parking lot. Parents arriving to pick up students are encouraged to park in front of the school. Time schedules for morning bus runs for Entiat Schools (**times approximate**) are listed below. Mid-day pick-up pre-K bus routes will be set when all students are registered and will be communicated to parents of pre-K students separately. **Please have your child at the bus stop five minutes early.** NOTE: Buses on up-river routes go to the furthest point on the route and turn and pick up students on the trip back to the school.

BUS RULES

Bus rules for the 2023-2024 school year are listed below. We are asking parents/guardians to review the rules with students. Each bus driver has tremendous responsibilities, and riders need to observe the rules so that each trip is safe. Violation of bus rules may bring about the loss of student riding privileges, for both limited and extended periods of time

- Keep aisle clear; Sit down in your seat; back to back; seat to seat and feet on the floor.
- Follow rules and directions the first time given.
- Talk quietly and be respectful.
- Use appropriate language; refrain from teasing and rude gestures.
- Keep hands, feet and objects to self.
- No eating, drinking, or chewing gum on the bus.
- The bus driver is always in charge.
- If using electronics, volume must be down.

All pre-K through 5th grade students need a backpack large enough to carry folders and paperwork. **No wheels** please.

All supplies other than folders are shared by the class. Please do not label with individual names.

DO NOT SEND pencil toppers shaped erasers, stencils, glitter glue, or other similar items.

NOTE for parents of elementary students! The school district has coordinated with the classroom teachers in grades preK-5 to reduce the amount of school supplies that parents are asked to provide in the fall. Instead, the district will purchase these supplies in bulk and help you keep a few more dollars in your pocket!

4th & 5th Grade Band: 1" binder (any color), 10 clear sleeves, pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencil, 1 high lighter. (needs/oil/grease as needed for instrument) Dress for Performances: Girl black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie.

P.E.: K-5: water bottle & tennis shoes that tie.

P.E.: 6th-12th grade: Black gym shorts or sweats, grey or orange shirt, socks and tennis shoes.

6th, 7th, & 8th: Pencils, pens (black or blue), erasers, 3-ring binder (no larger than 1"), 3 reams of notebooks paper, highlighter, dividers, pencil pouch, colored pencils, glue stick, 6 spiral notebooks, Scientific calculator (TI-34 Multi-View (recommended) or graphing calculator (TI-84 will be used in high school).

Art: Smock (old shirt is fine).

Band: Pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencil, 1 high lighter. (needs/oil/grease as needed for instrument). Dress for Performance: Girls: black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie. 3" inch binder, solid black marching shoes.

High School: Pencils, pens (blue or black), erasers, 3-ring binder, notebook paper, dividers, colored pencils, scissors, glue stick.

English: College ruled notebook - 100+ pages preferred, Highlighters, varying colors, Pens for marking, preferably blue or green, Folder/Pouch/Whatever your student finds best for staying organized

History: 2 college-ruled notebooks to be left in the classroom.

Math: graphing calculator (TI 83 or TI 84), 2.5" to 3" binder, 500 sheets of 3-hole punched graph paper (4 squares per inch), 2 red pens. Compass, protractor, subject dividers, 4 colored pencils (optional).

Science: Spiral bound notebook or composition notebook, colored pencils, folder, ruler.

Spanish: 5 packages of lined paper, small box of #2 pencils, Crayola markers, a highlighter and red pen.

Band: Pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencil, 1 high lighter. (needs/oil/grease as needed for instrument). Dress for Performance: Girls: black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie. 3" inch binder, solid black marching shoes.

Entiat School District -Implementing a New Cell Phone Policy for 24-25 School Year

Our commitment to the students, parents, staff, and community of the Entiat School District is to provide an environment that is safe for all students and allows them to reach their highest potential. As part of this commitment to learning and the health and well-being of our students, we will be implementing a new cellphone policy starting in the 2024- 25 school year. This policy, which applies to pre-kindergarten through 12th-grade students, will restrict cellphone use during school hours to foster a more conducive learning environment.

We are implementing this policy due to many factors, a few of which are listed below:

It's the Right Thing to Do: The research and evidence are quite clear that the use of smartphones and social media is having a harmful effect on our young people's mental health. Knowing this, we can no longer avoid addressing this.

Enhancing Academic Focus: Research indicates that cell phones can be a significant distraction in the classroom. By removing cell phones, students can better concentrate on their studies, leading to improved academic performance and a more engaging educational experience.

Addressing Mental Health Concerns: Insights from Jonathan Haidt's book, *The Anxious Generation*, highlight the link between excessive smartphone use and increased anxiety and depression among young people. Limiting cellphone use during school hours aims to mitigate these risks and promote a healthier school environment.





Final Forms

Parents need to go to our website and click on "Final Forms" on the left side of the page under "Quick Links".

If you have used Final Forms in the past, click on the "Parent Login". (If you have forgotten your password click "forgot password".) Log in and choose any sports that your student may want to participate in. It will add the forms for the specific sports they want to play. On the side you will see a list of RED forms. All forms will need to be clicked on and signed. They will turn either Yellow (this means your student needs to sign) or Green. If any are left RED then a signature is missing or something was not checked.

All ATHLETIC forms will need to be completed and a current physical will need to be on file BEFORE the first practice.

All ACADEMIC forms will need to be completed and any fees will need to be paid before a chrome book will be issued to students in grades 6-12.
