The Entiat School District Mission Statement

The mission of the Entiat School District is to provide all students with the necessary knowledge, skills, and attitudes to be productive and responsible citizens.

About our school

The Entiat School District operates a Pre-K-12 school, serving students in the extended Entiat community. The district has as its northern boundary the Navarre Coulee Junction with Highway 97A. To the south along 97A, the district extends to the southern edge of the Turtle Rock community. To the west, students attend from about twenty-six miles up the Entiat River Valley as well as from its side canyons. Lake Entiat on the Columbia River forms the eastern boundary of the district.

Our School Improvement Plan

Staff members have developed a comprehensive school improvement plan that meets the legal requirements of the State of Washington (WAC 180-16-220). More importantly, the plan contains 'Action Plan' items that serve as our road map for assuring that our students accomplish our district goals and we fulfill the district's mission. We have three goals for our students. Our goals are to see that:

- ♦ All students successfully complete every course and grade level and demonstrate proficiency on local, state, and national assessments.
- ♦ We eliminate the gaps in student achievement that are connected to English Language acquisition, socioeconomic status, and gender.
- ♦ Provide all students with the social experiences that support them in becoming responsible, productive citizens.

We are working together as a staff to answer four critical questions about our students and their learning. How effectively we answer these questions will determine how quickly we are able to fully deliver on our district mission. The four questions are:

- What do we want our students to learn?
- How will we know when they have learned it?
- How will we respond when some students don't learn?
- What will we do if students have already learned the information?

These questions guide us as we implement our school improvement plan.

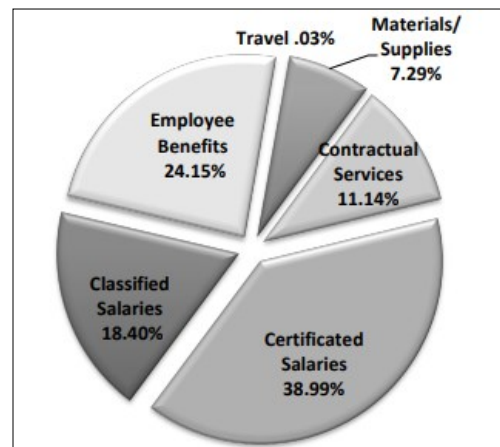

Expenditures—Other Funds

Transportation Vehicle Fund \$151,773.94

The Transportation Vehicle Fund's main source of revenue is depreciation funds paid annually by the state to the District for each bus in our fleet, and the funds are restricted mainly for purchasing new buses. In 2020-21, the school district purchased a new bus. We applied for and received a Dept. of Ecology grant for \$35,000 that was used to help pay for that bus. Our fleet currently consists of seven buses.

Capital Projects Fund \$3,629,717.64

The Capital Projects Fund is used to account for the acquisition or construction of major school facilities. In 2020-21, funds were expended on the project that upgraded and replaced the middle/high school HVAC system, most of the roofs on the MS/HS and elementary buildings, MS/HS windows, and outdated water heaters. The project also included a remodel of the school office and entry areas to provide for more secure access system into the school buildings. The project will be finished in summer 2021 and the balance of costs will be paid in the 2021-22 school year.

Debt Service Fund \$643,317.19

This expenditure amount represents the seventh bond principal and interest payments for the 2014-15 remodel of the elementary school. Due to low interest rates at the time of the bond sales, the school board was able to shorten the term of the bond payment schedule from 20 to 17 years, thereby saving taxpayers \$675,720 in interest over the term of the debt.

This expenditure also represents the first bond principal payment for the 20-21 upgrade/replacement of the middle/high school HVAC system, most of the roofs, MS/HS windows, outdated water heater and security improvements. Bonds were sold in June 2020, and once again the district benefits from historically low interest rates and was able to lock in a shorter term of 13 years for repayment.

Associated Student Body Fund \$20,969.58

The ASB Fund is used to account for student social and extracurricular activities, such as sports, clubs, and class funds. ASB funds are generated through the sale of ASB cards, sports event ticket sales, fundraising, and donations. Or 2020-21 ASB cards fees were waived, along with gate entrance fees due to COVID-19 (reduced sports and fans).

Condition of our facilities:





Our facilities are generally in good condition and we continue to maintain and improve them as necessary. We are now in the process of upgrading our intercom/clock infrastructure and keeping our technology reliable for our staff and students. Our building should not need any major work for quite a few years, but upgrading sports field remains a project on our list for the future.
