

NEW Washington SUN Bucks Summer EBT Program

What are SUN Bucks?

Starting this summer, families will receive funds to help buy food for children through a **new** Summer Electronic Benefit Transfer (S-EBT) program called **SUN Bucks**.

Background...

In December 2022, the federal government authorized a permanent, nationwide Summer EBT program to support children's access to food during the summer months. The WA Dept of Social and Health Services (DSHS) received federal approval to implement *SUN Bucks* in April 2024 and is partnering with the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to distribute these benefits starting this summer. (SUN Bucks may seem similar to the Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) program that operated during the past few summers, but it is a separate program. P-EBT ended along with the federal public health emergency in May 2023.)

How much money will each child get?

The SUN Bucks benefits, a one-time payment of **\$120 per eligible child** in each household, will be deposited onto new SUN Bucks cards and mailed to households beginning in mid June through the end of August.

Who will receive SUN Bucks?

Some children will be automatically eligible for SUN Bucks, while others will need to apply. (Note that unlike P-EBT, not all Entiat students will be eligible.)

Students will be automatically eligible for Summer EBT if they:

- Attend the Entiat School District and are coded as eligible for Free or Reduced meals in our system through being certified as receiving DSHS benefits (SNAP, TANF, Medicaid), being a student certified as migrant, foster, or homeless, or through a Family Income Survey; OR
- Are age 8–18 and are a member of a household that receives benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Food Assistance Program (FAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), or State-Funded Assistance (SFA);

Students who do not qualify automatically can apply by submitting a Summer EBT application directly. To qualify for SUN Bucks, these students must:

- Be enrolled at a school that participates in the NSLP or SBP (Entiat does), and
- Live in a household that meets NSLP <u>Income Eligibility Guidelines</u> to qualify for free or reduced-price meals.

The SUN Bucks application will soon be available online in English and Spanish. Applications will be accepted through August 31. Check here for information about the application: https://www.dshs.wa.gov/sunbucks.

Do these benefits expire?

Yes. SUN Bucks benefits expire and are removed 122 days from issuance. Unlike SNAP EBT, SUN Bucks are removed regardless of usage. Once benefits are removed from an EBT card, they cannot be replaced. (So use these benefits first!)

The Public Charge rule does not apply to SUN Bucks benefits and will not impact immigration status.

All pre-K through 5th grade students need a backpack large enough to carry folders and paperwork. *No wheels* please.

All supplies other than folders are shared by the class. Please do not label with individual names.

DO NOT SEND pencil toppers shaped erasers, stencils, glitter glue, or other similar items.

NOTE for parents of elementary students! The school district has coordinated with the classroom teachers in grades prek-5 to reduce the amount of school supplies that parents are asked to provide in the fall. Instead, the district will purchase these supplies in bulk and help you keep a few more dollars in your pocket!

4th & 5th Grade Band: 1" binder (any color), 10 clear sleeves, pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencil, 1 high lighter. (reeds/oil/grease as needed for instrument) Dress for Performances: Girl black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie.

P.E.: K-5: water bottle & tennis shoes that tie.

P.E.: 6th-12th grade: Black gym shorts or sweats, grey or orange shirt, socks and tennis shoes.

<u>6th, 7th, & 8th:</u> Pencils, pens (black or blue), erasers, 3-ring binder (no larger than 1"), 3 reams of notebooks paper, highlighter, dividers, pencil pouch, colored pencils, glue stick, 6 spiral notebooks, Scientific calculator (TI-34 Multi-View (recommended) or graphing calculator (TI-84 will be used in high school).

Art: Smock (old shirt is fine).

Band: Pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencil, 1 high lighter. (reeds/oil/grease as needed for instrument). Dress for Performance: Girls: black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie. 3" inch binder, solid black marching shoes.

High School: Pencils, pens (blue or black), erasers, 3-ring binder, notebook paper, dividers, colored pencils, scissors, glue stick.

English: College ruled notebook - 100+ pages preferred, Highlighters, varying colors, Pens for marking, preferably blue or green, Folder/Pouch/Whatever your student finds best for staying organized

History: 2 college-ruled notebooks to be left in the classroom.

Math: graphing calculator (TI 83 or TI 84), 2.5" to 3" binder, 500 sheets of 3-hole punched graph paper (4 squares per inch), 2 red pens. Compass, protractor, subject dividers, 4 colored pencils (optional).

Science: Spiral bound notebook or composition notebook, colored pencils, folder, ruler.

Spanish: 5 packages of lined paper, small box of #2 pencils, Crayola markers, a highlighter and red pen.
