

If a student's clothing is in violation of the dress code, the student will be asked to call home for a different wardrobe choice or wear an item from the school office to address the concern such as a tank top, shorts, leggings, or opaque tights.

If a student has a pattern of dress code violations, school administration will contact parents to share the concern and work together to solve the problem.

\*Holes in clothing should not interfere with a student's safety or create a disruption to the educational process (ex: distract self and/or others from learning).



Head coverings, hats, sunglasses, hoods, bandanas are not allowed in the building.


Straps/Sleeves must be at least 2 inches wide. Necklines must be no lower than a straight line between underarms. Stomach must be covered, no midriff showing. No mesh or sheer clothing with large holes\* unless approved clothing underneath.

Shorts, skirts and dresses must extend to mid-thigh. Students may not have holes\* in clothing above mid-thigh exposing skin. Pants worn below the top of the buttocks are not allowed.

Si la ropa de un estudiante infringe el Código de vestimenta, se le pedirá al estudiante llame a casa para elegir un vestuario diferente o que use un artículo de la oficina de la escuela para abordar la inquietud, como una camiseta sin mangas, pantalones cortos, mallas o medias opacas.

Si un estudiante tiene un patrón de violaciones al código de vestimenta, la administración de la escuela se comunicará con los padres para compartir la preocupación y trabajar juntos para resolver el problema.

\*Los agujeros en la ropa no deben interferir con la seguridad de un estudiante o crear una interrupción en el proceso educativo (por ejemplo, distraerse a sí mismo y / o a otros del aprendizaje).



No se permiten cubiertas para la cabeza, sombreros, gafas de sol, capuchas, pañuelos en el edificio.

Las correas / mangas deben tener al menos 2 pulgadas de ancho. Los escotes no deben ser más bajos que una línea recta entre las axilas. El estómago debe estar cubierto, sin que se vea la piel.

No se permiten ropa de malla o transparentes con grandes agujeros \* a menos que se utilice ropa aprobada debajo.

Los pantalones cortos, faldas y vestidos deben extenderse hasta la mitad del muslo. Los estudiantes no pueden tener agujeros \* en la ropa por encima de la mitad de muslo que exponga la piel.

No se permiten pantalones que se usen por debajo de la parte superior de las nalgas.

First, I am in awe that it is June. Every year that passes in education, I am amazed at how much faster the school year goes by. This school year was no exception.

I want to thank the many teams that have invested endless hours in making this school year another success; from our dedicated teachers and paraeducators, to our incredible cafeteria staff, maintenance crews, bus drivers, and district office staff. We also cannot forget our parents, parent groups, business partners, and community members. We thank you for your amazing support of Entiat's academic and athletic programs.

Our teams have already been busy planning for next year. We have laid out priorities to offer College in the High School over the next two years. This will allow students who want to remain at Entiat their Junior and Senior years, to register with either Central Washington University or Eastern Washington University in classes provided on campus. Although, next year we will dip our toes in the water with this process by offering a handful of courses, we anticipate full implementation of current course offerings the Fall of 2024. Our students will also continue to enjoy Wenatchee Valley Tech Center and Running Start through Wenatchee Valley College. These are a few of the many ways our Entiat Tigers can find a successful pathway to graduation, college, career, and beyond.

Looking ahead, our leadership team has been focused on building strong programs of support for our growing community. We have hired two new staff members. One will serve as our K-5 interventions (reading/math), as well as a K-5 Bilingual Specialist who will support elementary teams with English Language Development. We are excited to introduce these new staff to you when we return to school.

Our staff is also dedicated to providing summer support. X-STREME Summer School is being offered for students in current K-11 grades. Students will engage in hands-on learning by having experts visit us on site and by participating in some field trips. The learning obtained from these experiences will be applied in the classroom and through remediation from July 24th - August 10th. The program will run from 8 am - 12:15 pm, Monday to Thursday. A final word to the Entiat students. You are incredible! I am so thankful for all your hard work this year and your welcoming attitudes with all new students in our community!! Entiat partnered up with Cascade Fisheries this year to be part of the "Salmon in the classroom" program, but with a twist! We decided instead of just one class experiencing raising salmon from Eyed Eggs to Fry, that all of our students should get to watch the transformation. This year we received our Coho eggs in January from the Yakama Nation Fisheries, and once they reached Fry stage, Mrs. Tewell's and Ms. Johnson's classes went to the Dryden Dam with Miss Jen from Cascade Fisheries to release them into the Wenatchee River. Mr. Krik from Cascadia Conservation District joined us on this adventure, and he has also worked with Mrs. Tewell's class to learn about Wheat this year. After releasing the salmon, we traveled to the Leavenworth National Fish Hatchery to tour the hatchery and surrounding nature trails. Next year we are looking forward to receiving salmon eggs from the Entiat Fish Hatchery, so that we can release them into the Entiat River!

Mrs. Tewell is going to continue to partner with Cascade Fisheries, Cascadia Conservation District, and Fish and Wildlife Services to provide opportunities for our students. Cascadia Conservation District has applied for a grant that would allow them to partner with Entiat School District to provide learning opportunities, field trips, guest speakers and possibly a school garden, over the next 3 years. Cross your fingers they get this grant! Cascadia Conservation District is also working on a few restoration projects in the Entiat Valley that they are hoping to have Entiat students help with starting in the 2023-2024 school year. We look forward to getting our students involved!
