Students in Ms. Johnson's second grade class had so much fun learning about Ozobots! Students practiced drawing paths and coding directions for Ozobots with markers. An Ozobot follows a black marker line. Students code with blue, red, and green markers to tell the Ozobot what to do. The Ozobot reads the code and does the action it was coded to do, such as spin around, go backwards, increase speed, etc. Student's can check to see if the Ozobot reads their code as the top of the Ozobot lights up in the color it reads. Ozobots can be checked out at our local library.

CHILD FIND - MARCH 6TH



Child Find is a federal program available through public schools that is designed to locate and evaluate children, age birth through age 21, who may have a disability that hinders educational development. Entiat School District offers this free screening to children who live within the district's boundaries, including home schooled and private school students. If your family is living in a temporary situation, you may contact the school district where you are staying to attend a screening, as all Washington school districts have Child Find screenings available.

Children may qualify for special education and related health services if they have delays in speech, language, fine motor, gross motor, behavior skills, and/or learning, or if their learning is impacted by vision, hearing and mobility limitations.

The mission of the Entiat School District is to provide all students with the necessary knowledge, skills, and attitudes to be productive and responsible citizens.

About our School

The Entiat School District operates a Pre-K-12 school, serving students in the extended Entiat community. The district has as its northern boundary the Navarre Coulee Junction with Highway 97A. To the south along 97A, the district extends to the southern edge of the Turtle Rock community. To the west, students attend from about twenty-six miles up the Entiat River Valley as well as from its side canyons. Lake Entiat on the Columbia River forms the eastern boundary of the district.

Our School Improvement Plan

Staff members have developed a comprehensive school improvement plan that meets the legal requirements of the State of Washington (WAC 180-16-220). More importantly, the plan contains 'Action Plan' items that serve as our road map for assuring that our students accomplish our district goals and we fulfill the district's mission. We have three goals for our students. Our goals are to see that:

- ♦ All students successfully complete every course and grade level and demonstrate proficiency on local, state, and national assessments.
- ♦ We eliminate the gaps in student achievement that are connected to English Language acquisition, socioeconomic status, and gender.
- ♦ Provide all students with the social experiences that support them in becoming responsible, productive citizens.

We are working together as a staff to answer four critical questions about our students and their learning. How effectively we answer these questions will determine how quickly we are able to fully deliver on our district mission. The four questions are:

What do we want our students to learn?

How will we know when they have learned it?

How will we respond when some students don't learn?

What will we do if students have already learned the information?

These questions guide us as we implement our school improvement plan.

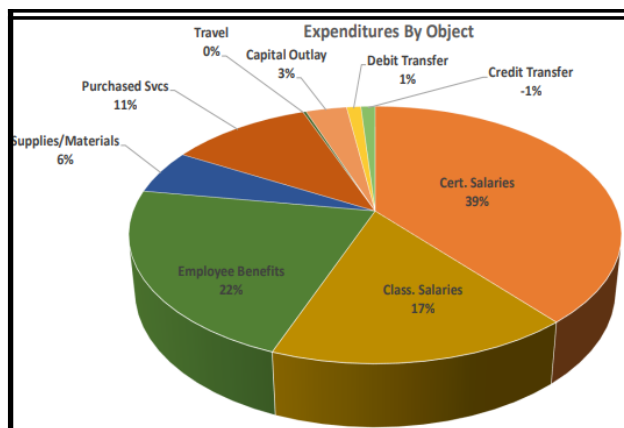

Expenditures—Other Funds

Transportation Vehicle Fund \$0

The Transportation Vehicle Fund's main source of revenue is depreciation funds paid annually by the state to the District for each bus in our fleet, and the funds are restricted mainly for purchasing new buses. In 2021-22, the school district did not purchase any vehicles. We have ordered a new bus which is set to arrive in the fall of 2023. Our fleet currently consists of seven buses.

Capital Projects Fund \$588,708.67

The Capital Projects Fund is used to account for the acquisition or construction of major school facilities. The bulk of the project was done in 2020-21, which included the project that upgraded and replaced the middle/high school HVAC system, most of the roofs on the MS/HS and elementary buildings, MS/HS windows, and outdated water heaters. The project also included a remodel of the school office and entry areas to provide for more secure access system into the school buildings. In 2021-2022, funds were expended to complete the project in summer of 2021 and the balance of costs were paid.

Debt Service Fund \$718,650.00

This expenditure amount represents the eighth bond principal and interest payments for the 2014-15 remodel of the elementary school. Due to low interest rates at the time of the bond sales, the school board was able to shorten the term of the bond payment schedule from 20 to 17 years, thereby saving taxpayers **\$675,720** in interest over the term of the debt.

This expenditure also represents the bond principal and interest payment for the 20-21 upgrade/replacement of the middle/high school HVAC system, most of the roofs, MS/HS windows, outdated water heater and security improvements. Bonds were sold in June 2020, and once again the district benefited from historically low interest rates and was able to lock in a shorter term of 13 years for repayment.

Associated Student Body Fund \$26,328.30

Condition of our Facilities:

Our facilities are generally in good condition and we continue to maintain and improve them as necessary. We are now in the process of upgrading our intercom/clock infrastructure and keeping our technology reliable for our staff and students. Our building should not need any major work for quite a few years, but upgrading sports field remains a project on our list for the future.

PRESCHOOL & KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION!!

On **Monday, March 6**, the elementary school office will begin accepting registration forms for preschool and kindergarten students for the 2023-24 school year. Registration packets will be available on **March 1** in the elementary office, or you may call Secretary Marilyn Kamphaus and request that one be mailed to you. Students are not considered registered unless the school has received a completed packet. Registration help is available in English and Spanish in the office.

PRESCHOOL INFORMATION:

It is important that you register early so that your preference for morning or afternoon can be considered as students are assigned to a session. Preference will be given to students who reside in the Entiat School District, and non-residents will be enrolled as space permits. To enter **Preschool**, children must be **4 years of age** on or before August 31, 2023.

KINDERGARTEN INFORMATION:

Only children who were not enrolled in our district preschool at the end of the 2022-23 school year must register for kindergarten for 2023-24. Children must be **5 years of age** on or before August 31, 2023 to enter **kindergarten**.

When you submit your registration packet, you will also need to bring:

- ◆ Your child's **birth certificate**
- ◆ Your child's **immunization record** – law requires that the immunization record be **medically verified**. This means immunization records must be from a health care provider or verified by a health care provider. Here are examples of acceptable records:

If your current living situation is such that you cannot provide all documents needed, please contact the Counselor, Susan Morris at 784-1314.

- * A completed Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) signed by a health care provider
- * A CIS filled out by the parent/guardian with medical records attached
- * A CIS printed by a health care provider or school from the online Washington State Immunization Information System
- * A CIS printed from MyIR, a free Dept. of Health online tool that allows families to view and print their official record themselves
- * If the parent/guardian is requesting an exemption from one or more of the immunization requirements (MMR is not eligible for exemption), the parent/guardian must provide the school a completed Certificate of Exemption

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS:

If your child's immunizations are not current at registration time, and you have immunizations scheduled for prior to the start of school, proof of a doctor's appointment date will be acceptable for registration. Immunizations must be current before the start of school and the medically verified record must be submitted **before a student can attend school** – this is a requirement of the new law.

Washington law requires children entering **Preschool or Kindergarten** to have the following immunizations:

Vaccine	Requirement
<u>PRESCHOOL ONLY (Not needed for Kindergarten):</u>	
Hib (Haemophilus influenzae type B)	3 or 4 doses (depending on vaccine used)
PCV (Pneumococcal Conjugate)	Up to 4 doses, depending on when given before age 5
<u>PRESCHOOL & KINDERGARTEN:</u>	
Hepatitis B	3 doses
DTaP (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis)	5 doses (4 doses only IF dose #4 given on or after 4 th birthday and at least 6 months after dose #3)
Varicella (Chickenpox)	2 doses OR Health Care Provider verification of disease
Polio (IPV)	4 doses (3 doses only IF dose #3 given on or after 4 th birthday and at least 6 months after dose #2)
Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR)	2 doses

FREE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Through Children's Home Society in Wenatchee, Entiat School District now has available completely school-based mental health services at no charge for youth that are uninsured or underinsured for those services. Due to a grant obtained from OSPI, CHSW can serve students that may not have full financial coverage for any reason. Clinicians would be able to meet students at school, including intake and assessments.

¡¡REGISTRO DE PREESCOLAR Y KÍNDER!!

A partir del **lunes 11 de marzo**, la oficina de la escuela primaria comenzará a aceptar paquetes de registro para estudiantes de preescolar y kínder para el año escolar 2023-24. Empezando el **1 de marzo**, paquetes de registro estarán disponibles en la oficina de la escuela primaria, o puede llamar y pedir que se los manden por correo. Los estudiantes no se consideran registrados hasta que la escuela haya recibido un paquete **completo**. La ayuda de registro está disponible en inglés y español en la oficina.

INFORMACIÓN DE PREESCOLAR:

Es importante que se registre temprano para que su preferencia de por la mañana o la tarde pueda ser considerada cuando asignamos a estudiantes a una sesión. Se dará preferencia a los estudiantes que residen en el Distrito Escolar de Entiat, y los que no residen en Entiat se inscribirá cuando el espacio lo permita. Para entrar **Preescolar**, los niños deben tener **4 años** en o antes del 31 de agosto de 2023.

INFORMACIÓN DE KÍNDER:

Sólo los niños que no estaban registrados en nuestro preescolar del distrito al final del año escolar 2022-23 deben registrarse para kínder para el año escolar 2023-24. Los niños deben tener **5 años** en o antes del 31 de agosto de 2023 para entrar al **kínder**.

Cuando entregar su paquete de registro, también tendrá que traer:

- ♦ el **certificado de nacimiento** de su hijo/a
- ♦ el **registro de vacunas** de su hijo/a– requiere que el registro de vacunas sea **verificado medicamente**. Esto significa que los registros de vacunas deben ser de un proveedor de servicios médicos o verificados por un proveedor de servicios médicos. Aquí están los ejemplos de registros aceptables:

Si su situación es tal que usted no puede proporcionar todos los documentos necesarios, por favor comuníquese con Susan Morris al 784-1314.

- * Un Certificado de Estado de Vacunas (CEV) (CIS, por sus siglas en inglés) completo y firmado por un proveedor médico.
- * Un CEV (CIS) completado por usted u otro padre o tutor legal con registros médicos adjuntos
- * Un CEV (CIS) impreso por un proveedor médico o una escuela usando el Sistema Informático de Vacunas del estado de Washington.
- * Un CEV (CIS) impreso desde el portal MyIR (en inglés), un instrumento gratis en línea del Departamento de Salud que permite a las familias ver e imprimir sus registros oficiales de vacunas.
- * Si solicita una exención de uno o más de los requisitos de vacunación, debe proporcionarle a la escuela un Certificado de exención completo.

REQUISITOS DE VACUNAS:

Si las vacunas de su hijo/a no están actualizadas en el momento de registro, y tiene las vacunas previstas antes del inicio de la escuela, prueba de la fecha de la cita de un doctor será aceptable para el registro. Las vacunas deben ser actualizadas antes del primer día de clases y el registro de vacunas verificado medicamente, presentado **antes de que el estudiante pueda asistir a clases** – esto es un requisito de la nueva ley.

La ley de Washington requiere que los niños que entran **Preescolar o Kínder** tengan las vacunas siguientes:

Hib (Haemophilus influenzae tipo B)	3 o 4 dosis (dependiendo de la vacuna usada)

PRESCHOOL & KINDERGARTEN:	
Hepatitis B	3 dosis
DTaP (difteria, tétanos, tos ferina)	5 dosis (4 dosis solo si la dosis #4 se administra en o después de 4 años y al menos 6 meses después de la dosis #3)
Varicela (viruela loca)	2 dosis o verificación de la enfermedad por parte del proveedor médico
Polio (IPV)	4 dosis (3 dosis solo si la dosis #4 se administra en o después de 4 años y al menos 6 meses después de la dosis #2)


