CHILD FIND

Child Find is a federal program available through public schools that is designed to locate and evaluate children, age birth through age 21, who may have a disability that hinders educational development. Entiat School District offers this free screening to children who live within the district's boundaries, including home-schooled and private school students. If your family is living in a temporary situation, you may contact the school district where you are staying to attend a screening, as all Washington school districts have Child Find screenings available.

Children may qualify for special education and related health services if they have delays in speech, language, fine motor, gross motor, behavior skills, and/or learning, or if their learning is impacted by vision, hearing and mobility limitations.

Child Find Screening will be held on May 9th from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm. No Appointment is needed, for more information contact Elementary Secretary Marilyn Kamphaus at 784-1314.



CHILD FIND

Child Find es un programa federal disponible a través de escuelas publicas que están diseñado para localizar y evaluar a los niños, edad de nacimiento hasta los 21 años, que pueden tener una discapacidad que dificulta el desarrollo educativo. El distrito escolar de Entiat ofrece esta evaluación gratis a los niños que viven dentro de los límites del distrito incluso estudiantes educados en casa y escuelas privadas. Si su familia está viviendo en una situación temporal, usted puede ponerse en contacto con el distrito escolar donde usted se hospeda para obtener una evaluación ya que todos los distritos escolares de Washington tienen Child Find evaluaciones disponibles.

Los niños pueden calificar para educación especial y servicios de salud relacionados si tienen retrasos en el habla, lenguaje, habilidades motoras finas, habilidades motoras gruesas, destrezas de comportamiento, y/o aprendizaje, o si su aprendizaje es impactado por limitaciones de visión, audición y movilidad.

Child Find Screening se llevará a cabo el 9 de mayo de 9:00 am a 3:00 pm. No se necesita una cita, para obtener más información, comuníquese con la secretaria de primaria Marilyn Kamphaus al 784-1314.

Dear Families,

As part of our ongoing efforts to foster a school climate of respect, and as part of our fifth grade health curriculum, we will begin a unit on Family Life and Sexual Health. We want to let you know about the unit for three reasons.

First, you are welcome to contact me and I can leave the curriculum in the office for you to preview the materials. You can also visit: www.kingcounty.gov/flash and scroll down to the link "4/5/6 FLASH" and it will link you to all the lessons. The units we will study are: Self-Esteem, Gender Roles, Friendship, Decision Making, Sexual Exploitation, Puberty, Reproductive Systems, Pregnancy (how babies grow), and HIV/AIDS.

Second, if you decide not to have your child participate in the unit or particular lessons in the unit, I am happy to discuss it with you. There is a district waiver form that must be completed for your student to opt out of some or all of the lessons because it is a Washington State Law that I teach these Health lessons.

Third, we want to encourage you to discuss the topic at home too. Your child may bring home "family homework exercises" to do with an adult in the family (however s/he defines "family"). These assignments are strictly optional. They are also confidential; students will NOT be asked to report back what you have discussed. The purpose of these assignments is simply to give you a chance to communicate with one another and open the door for discussions and family rules. If more than one adult in the family wants to participate in these exercises, that's great. You may want to take turns, so the student gets special time with each adult.

Please give me a call if you have any questions. I am glad to discuss the philosophy of the curriculum with you.

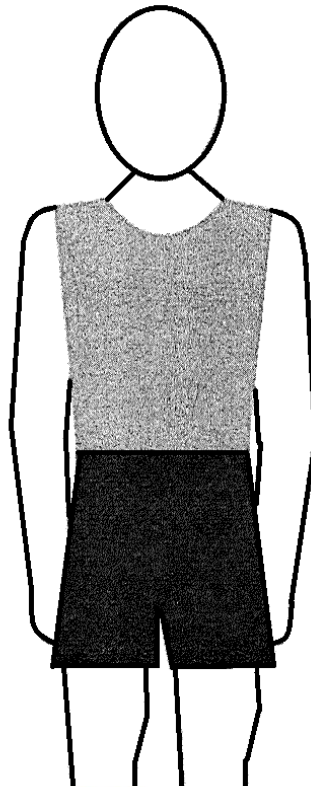

WARM WEATHER IS COMING! PLAN AHEAD.

If a student's clothing is in violation of the **dress code**, the student will be asked to call home for a different wardrobe choice or wear an item from the school office to address the concern such as a tank top, shorts, leggings, or opaque tights.

If a student has a pattern of dress code violations, school administration will contact parents to share the concern and work together to solve the problem.

*Holes in clothing should not interfere with a student's safety or create a disruption to the educational process (ex: distract self and/or others from learning).



Head coverings, hats, sunglasses, hoods, bandanas are not allowed in the building.

Straps/Sleeves must be at least 2 inches wide. Necklines must be no lower than a straight line between underarms. Stomach must be covered, no midriff showing.

No Mesh or sheer clothing with large holes* unless approved clothing underneath.

Shorts, skirts and dresses must extend to mid-thigh. Students may not have holes* in clothing about mid-thigh exposing skin.

Pants worn below the top of the buttocks are not allowed.

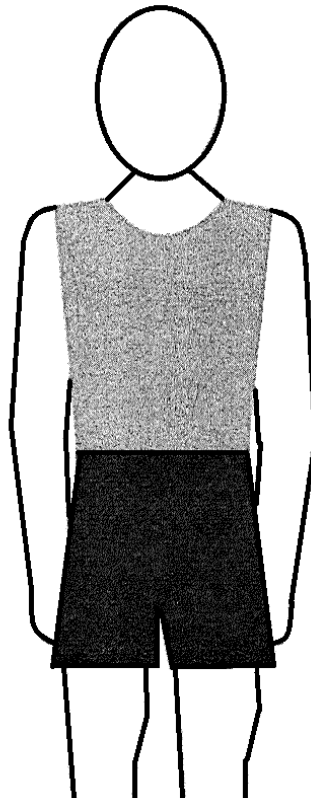


¡ILEGA EL TIEMPO CÁLIDO! PLANIFICA CON ANTICIPACIÓN.

Si la ropa de un estudiante infringe el Código de vestimenta, se le pedirá al estudiante que llame a casa para elegir un vestuario diferente o que use un artículo de la oficina de la escuela para abordar la inquietud, como una camiseta sin mangas, pantalones cortos, mallas o medias opacas.

Sin un estudiante tiene un patron de violaciones al código de vestimenta, la administración de la escuela se comunicará con los padres para compartir la preocupación y trabajar juntos para resolver el problema.

*Los agujeros en la ropa no deben interferir con la seguridad de un estudiante o crear una interrupción en el proceso educativo (por ejemplo, distraerse a sí mismo y / o a otros del aprendizaje).



No se permiten cubiertas para la cabeza, sombreros, gafas de sol, capuchas, pañuelos en el edificio.

Las correas / mangas deben tener al menos 2 pulgadas de ancho. Los escotes no deben ser más bajos que una línea recta entre las axilas. El estómago debe estar cubierto, sin que se vea la piel.

No se permiten ropa de malla o transparentes con grandes agujeros * a menos que se utilice ropa aprobada debajo.

Los pantalones cortos, faldas y vestidos deben extenderse hasta la mitad del muslo. Los estudiantes no pueden tener agujeros * en la ropa por encima de la mitad de muslo que exponga la piel.

No se permiten pantalones que se usen por debajo de la parte superior de las nalgas.
