Annual Notification for Title I Programs

Entiat School District is a Title I District

Paul Rumburg Elementary School participates in the Title I Schoolwide Program. Title I, Part A is part of the Every Student Succeeds Act. Its goal is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach proficiency on challenging state academic standards. Our Title I schools qualify for federal grant money which we use for additional staffing, parent involvement, staff development, and extended school day opportunities to help us meet that goal. District and School Report Card Information

Are you interested in knowing how your child's school did on state assessments or how different groups of children performed compared to other schools? You can find out by going to reportcard.ospi.k12.wa.us. The Report Card contains information about test results as well as other statistics about the school. To find results for Entiat Schools, use the drop down menu in the box at the top left of the webpage to find Entiat School District and press go. To find results for your child's school, follow those directions to go to Entiat School District, then use the drop down menu to find either Paul Rumburg Elementary or Entiat Middle School/High School.

Right to Request Teacher and Para Qualifications

All parents and guardians have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher(s) or instructional paraeducators. If you request this information, the district will provide you with the following:

1. Whether the teacher has met Washington teacher certification requirements for the grade level and subjects in which the teacher provides instruction;
2. Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency or other provisional status for which Washington qualifications or certification has been waived;
3. The college major of the teacher and any graduate degree or certificate; and
4. Whether your child is receiving Title I services from paraprofessionals, and if so, whether those paraprofessionals meet state/federal requirements of the Every Student Succeeds Act. Attendance Matters

Washington state law requires all children *between ages 8 and 18* to attend school regularly. Parents or legal guardians are required to make sure their children are in school regularly. The law requires that students are *in school, full-time, every day*, unless there is a *valid excuse*. If a student *misses school without a valid excuse*, the student might be considered “*truant*.” When a student is truant, schools are required to:

- Notify the family;
- Meet and work with the family and student to figure out why, and

Try different strategies to help improve the student's attendance.

If a student *misses school a lot*, even with a valid excuse, the law now requires schools to meet and work with the family to figure out why, and make a plan to help the student get to school regularly. That is because missing school a lot or “*chronic absenteeism*” can make it hard for a student to keep up. It can also be a sign that a student might not be getting the supports they need. When we are talking about missing school, “a lot” can seem like “a little” – missing *even just 2 days a month* can add up to a big impact! If that doesn't work, a student and family will be referred to a Community Engagement Board or to court.

Entiat School District Absence Strategies and Interventions Timeline

** Failure to appear at an agreed upon, scheduled meeting will result in a truancy petition filed with Chelan County.

1 – Unexcused absence – Call home

Between 3-5 Unexcused absences – Administer the WARNS assessment

No later than the 7th Unexcused absence – Meet with Community Engagement Board

10 Unexcused absences or 15 Excused absences – File a truancy petition with the Court.







I AM READY TO GO BACK TO SCHOOL WHEN...

Fever free without the assistance of medication for 24hrs. (Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Motrin, Advil)	Free from vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hrs.	Cough is well controlled (resolving and breathing comfortably)	After 24hrs of antibiotic treatment, eyes no longer oozing or eye has cleared out	Free from rash, itching, sores are dry, or could be covered by a bandage, or with orders from Dr.	School has orders from Dr. Please work with school nurse to address special health care so student may attend safely
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Home is the best place for a student who is ill. If your student is sick with a diagnosed communicable disease (this would include influenza or COVID-19), please notify the school as soon as possible. This notification will greatly assist others who, due to medical reasons and/or treatments, have weakened immune systems and may require immediate and specialized care.

If your student has strep throat or another bacterial infection, student must stay home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours and your health care provider has given permission for your child to return to school.
