BUS ROUTES & LOADING ZONES

Buses will load and unload students in the bus loading zone, in the north elementary parking lot. Parents arriving to pick up students are encouraged to park in front of the school. Time schedules for morning bus runs for Entiat Schools (**times approximate**) are listed below. Mid-day pick-up pre-K bus routes will be set when all students are registered and will be communicated to parents of pre-K students separately. **Please have your child at the bus stop five minutes early.** NOTE: Buses on up-river routes go to the furthest point on the route and turn and pick up students on the trip back to the school.

BUS RULES

Bus rules for the 2023-2024 school year are listed below. We are asking parents/guardians to review the rules with students. Each bus driver has tremendous responsibility, and riders need to observe the rules so that each trip is safe. Violation of bus rules may bring about the loss of student riding privileges, for limited or extended periods of time

- Keep aisle clear; Sit down in your seat: back to back: seat to seat, and feet on the floor.
- Follow rules and directions the first time given.
- Talk quietly and be respectful.
- Use appropriate language; refrain from teasing and rude gestures.
- Keep hands, feet and objects to self.
- No eating, drinking, or chewing gum on the bus.
- The bus driver is always in charge.
- If using electronics, volume must be down.

All pre-K through 5th grade students need a backpack large enough to carry folders and paperwork. **No wheels** please.

All supplies other than folders are shared by the class. Please do not label with individual names.

DO NOT SEND pencil toppers shaped erasers, stencils, glitter glue, or other similar items.

NOTE for parents of elementary students! The school district has coordinated with the classroom teachers in grades preK-5 to reduce the amount of school supplies that parents are asked to provide in the fall. Instead, the district will purchase these supplies in bulk and help you keep a few more dollars in your pocket!

4th & 5th Grade Band: 1" binder (any color), 10 clear sleeves, pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencils, 1 highlighter. (needs/oil/grease as needed for instrument) Dress for Performances Girls: black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie.

P.E.: K-5: water bottle & tennis shoes that tie.

P.E.: 6th-12th grade: Black gym shorts or sweats, grey or orange shirt, socks and tennis shoes.

Middle School: Pencils, pens (black or blue), erasers, 3-ring binder, notebooks paper, highlighter, dividers, pencil pouch, colored pencils, glue stick, 6 spiral notebooks, Scientific calculator (TI-34 Multi-View (recommended) or graphing calculator (TI-84 will be used in high school).

Art: Smock (old shirt is fine).

Band: Pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencils, 1 highlighter. (needs/oil/grease as needed for instrument). Dress for Performance: Girls: black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie. 3" inch binder, solid black marching shoes.

High School: Pencils, pens (blue or black), erasers, 3-ring binder, notebook paper, dividers, colored pencils, scissors, glue stick.

Band: Pencil pouch to fit inside binder, 2 pencils, 1 highlighter. (needs/oil/grease as needed for instrument). Dress for Performance: Girls: black skirt/pants and white top. Boys: Black slacks, white button-up shirt & tie. 3" inch binder, solid black marching shoes.

Art: Smock (old shirt is fine).

History: 1.5" or 2" binder to be left in the classroom.

Math: graphing calculator (TI 83 or TI 84), 2.5" to 3" binder, 500 sheets of 3-hole punched graph paper (4 squares per inch), 2 red pens. Compass, protractor, subject dividers, 4 colored pencils (optional).

Science: Spiral bound notebook or composition notebook, 1.5" 3-ring binder, ruler.

Spanish: 5 packages of lined paper, small box of #2 pencils, Crayola markers, a highlighter and red pen.

Just a few short days ago, the doors opened to our students. While we are trying to get a final count, we know our enrollment is significantly higher than the first day of school exactly one year ago. In fact, we expect we may have 90+ more students. For superintendents and business managers, an increase in enrollment is mostly a positive development as it helps with funding. 

CEP CONTINUES IN 2023-2024:

We are pleased to announce that the Entiat School District will continue to participate in a federal program called the **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)**. This program allows all children in our schools to receive school breakfast and lunch at no charge. Entiat has been approved to offer this program through the 2024-25 school year.

What does this mean for students who attend Entiat School District? In a CEP school, all students receive a nutritious breakfast and lunch **at no cost, regardless of family income.**

BUT WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Since some education programs we provide are funded with state dollars that are based on the economic level of our community, we must provide income data to the state.

We will no longer be collecting Free and Reduced-Price Applications, but instead, we will collect the new **Family Income Survey**. This form helps us collect household information for all students attending CEP schools. **Without this information, the District could lose important state funding for educational programs that our students are entitled to.**

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Please take a moment to complete the **Family Income Survey** and return it to your student's school. Only one survey is needed per family.
