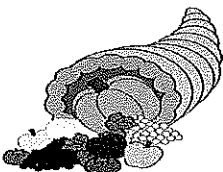

## Focus on Education

November is Washington's Focus on Education Month. This year we are partnering with the North Central ESD (Educational Service District), the 29 districts that represent 42,000 students throughout the north central region, and WASA (Washington Association of School Administrators) in our efforts to urge our legislature to take action now by:

**Complying with the Paramount Duty** outlined in our State Constitution to provide ample funding for all K-12 children by implementing the new basic education finance system adopted in ESHB 2261 and SHB 2776 for prototypical schools.

**Expanding Available State Resources...** The current State budget and revenue structure cannot accommodate the required increases in basic education funding necessary to comply with the McCleary decision as well as the State's prototypical schools funding model, nor does it provide adequate revenue to address capital costs or educator compensation.

**Ensuring fair and competitive employee Compensation/Recruitment...** We urge the legislature to fully fund a competitive compensation system to insure that the state not only meets its obligation to reduce reliance on local levies, but allows the state to meet its promised pension obligations.

**Ensuring and Enhancing School Construction Assistance...** To ensure all school districts have the resources to secure additional facility space necessary to accommodate all-day Kindergarten and K-3 class size reduction.

## REGULATION OF DANGEROUS WEAPONS ON SCHOOL PREMISES

It is a violation of district policy and state law for any person to carry a firearm or dangerous weapon on school premises, school-provided transportation or areas of other facilities being used exclusively for school activities.

The superintendent is directed to see that all school facilities post "Gun-Free Zone" signs, and that all violations of this policy and RCW 9.41.280 are reported annually to the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The following persons may carry firearms into school buildings, as necessary, although students engaged in these activities are restricted to the possession of rifles on school premises:

- A. Persons engaged in military, law enforcement, or school district security activities;
- B. Persons involved in a school authorized convention, showing, demonstration, lecture or firearm safety course;
- C. Persons competing in school authorized firearm or air gun competitions; and
- D. Any federal, state or local law enforcement officer.

The following persons over eighteen years of age and not enrolled as students may have firearms in their possession on school property outside of school buildings:

- A. Persons with concealed weapons permits issued pursuant to RCW 9.41.070 who are picking up or dropping off students; and
- B. Persons conducting legitimate business at the school and in lawful possession of a firearm or dangerous weapon if the weapon is secured within an attended vehicle, is unloaded and secured in a vehicle, or is concealed from view in a locked, unattended vehicle.

Persons may bring dangerous weapons, other than firearms, onto school premises if the weapons are lawfully within the person's possession and are to be used in a school-authorized martial arts class.

Persons over eighteen years of age and persons between fourteen and eighteen years of age with written parental or guardian permission may possess personal protection spray devices on school property. No one under eighteen years of age may deliver such devices, nor may anyone eighteen years or older deliver a spray device to anyone under fourteen or to anyone between fourteen and eighteen who does not have parental permission.

Personal protection spray devices may not be used other than in self-defense as defined by state law. Possession, transmission or use of personal protection spray devices under any other circumstances is a violation of district policy.

School officials shall notify the student's parents or guardians and the appropriate law enforcement agency of known or suspected violations of this policy. Students who violate this policy shall be subject to discipline, including a one-year expulsion for a violation involving a firearm. However, the superintendent may modify the one-year expulsion on a case-by-case basis.

## REGLAMENTO DE ARMAS PELIGROSAS EN ESTABLECIMIENTOS ESCOLARES

Es una violación de la póliza del distrito y ley estatal para cualquier persona que lleve un arma de fuego o arma peligrosa en los establecimientos escolares, transporte escolar o áreas de otros establecimientos que están siendo utilizados exclusivamente para actividades escolares.

El superintendente está dirigido a averiguar que todos los establecimientos escolares coloquen signos que digan: "Zona Libre de Armas", y que todas las violaciones de esta política y RCW 9.41.280 sean reportadas anualmente al Superintendente de Instrucción Pública.

Las siguientes personas pueden llevar armas de fuego en los edificios escolares, según como sea necesario, aunque los estudiantes que participen en estas actividades estén restringidos a la posesión de rifles en los establecimientos escolares:

- A. Las personas dedicadas a actividades militares, policiales, o de la seguridad del distrito escolar;
- B. Las personas involucradas en una convención autorizada por la escuela, mostrando, una demostración, lectura o curso de seguridad de arma de fuego;
- C. Las personas que compiten bajo autorización escolar en competencias de armas de fuego o armas de aire;
- D. Cualquier policía federal, estatal o local.

Las siguientes personas mayores de dieciocho años de edad y que no están inscritos como estudiantes pueden tener armas de fuego en su posesión en la propiedad escolar fuera de los edificios escolares:

- A. Las personas con permisos de armas ocultas publicados de acuerdo con RCW 9.41.070 quienes recogen o dejan a estudiantes; y
- B. Las personas que hacen un negocio legítimo en la escuela y en la posesión legal de un arma de fuego o arma peligrosa si el arma es asegurada dentro de un vehículo asistido, están descargadas y aseguradas en un vehículo o están ocultas de la visión en un vehículo desatendido cerrado con llave.

Las personas pueden traer armas peligrosas, con excepción de las armas de fuego, en establecimientos escolares si las armas se encuentran legalmente en posesión de la persona y se van a utilizar en una clase de artes marciales autorizada por la escuela.

Personas mayores de dieciocho años de edad y personas entre catorce y dieciocho años de edad con autorización escrita de los padres o guardianes pueden poseer dispositivos de aerosol de protección personal en la propiedad escolar. Ninguna persona menor de dieciocho años de edad puede repartir este tipo de dispositivos, ni nadie de dieciocho años de edad o más puede ofrecer un dispositivo de aerosol a menores de catorce o a cualquier persona entre catorce y dieciocho años que no tenga permiso de los padres.

Dispositivos de aerosol de protección personal no pueden ser utilizados, excepto por defensa propia como se define por la ley estatal. Posesión, transmisión o utilización de dispositivos de aerosol de protección personal usada bajo cualquier otra circunstancia es una violación de la póliza del distrito.

Los oficiales escolares notificarán a los padres o guardianes del estudiante y la agencia de leyes apropiada tocante las violaciones conocidas o sospechosas de esta póliza. Los estudiantes que violen esta póliza estarán sujetos a medidas disciplinarias, incluyendo expulsión de un año por una violación que implica un arma de fuego. Sin embargo, el superintendente puede modificar la expulsión de un año basado en caso por caso.


